- Non-levy employers (payroll under £3m) typically pay just 5% of the training cost, with the government covering the rest
- Some apprenticeships are fully funded depending on circumstances
- There are no recruitment or administration fees

Time Commitment

Apprentices are expected to complete approximately 6 hours per week of "off-the-job" training—this may include workshops, coaching, mentoring, or online modules. All learning is paid time and complements their role rather than detracts from it.

Employer Responsibilities

To support an apprentice, your organisation must:

- Provide a paid role aligned with the apprenticeship standard
- Allow time each week for off-the-job training
- Assign a workplace mentor or line manager
- Collaborate with Sport Structures to monitor progress and support outcomes
